Bed Bugs Management

Adult bed bugs are on average 5 mm long and have an oval-shaped and flattened body. The common bed bug has long been a pest – feeding on blood, causing itchy bites and generally irritating their human hosts.

Bedbugs are small, wingless insects that feed exclusively on the blood of warm-blooded animals. Humans are the preferred hosts for two main species.

Bedbugs are seen as growing problem within all types of dwellings, including Private homes, Dormitories, Army Barracks, Buses and Trains.
