

Termite Management

There are two categories of termite treatments: Preconstruction and Postconstruction treatments.

Preconstruction Treatments are protective treatments that are applied as a building is being built, and shortly after the building is completed. Postconstruction treatments that are applied to older and established buildings.

Termiticide treatments do not last indefinitely, buildings need to be periodically re-treated for termites in order to maintain termite protection.

Facts about Termites

- Termites never sleep and build their colonies 24 hours a day.
- Ants and Termites are enemies. Ants are number one predator and competition for termites.
- Termites build their colonies upward, can even be up to 30 feet high.
- Termite damage is expensive. It needs to be treated immediately.
- Termites are eusocial. They live in a caste system.
- Worker termites feed others.
- Termite colonies spend a great deal of time grooming one another in order to prevent disease.
- Termite queens decide which caste her young will grow.
- Termites have sense organs. They use vibrations to communicate with one another.
